Barriers to inclusion: these are some of the barriers to inclusion identified by Islington School Governors. You may have others to

- Negative attitudes e.g. value of teaching children with disabilities, family members have low expectations
- Invisibility
- Cost
- Inadequate funding
- Physical access
- Class sizes
- Poverty
- Gender discrimination
- Dependency
- Emergencies e.g. conflict, refugees
- Inadequate policies and standards.
- Lack of services
- Problems with service delivery e.g. poor co-ordination, inadequate staffing
- Lack of accessibility built environments, transport systems, information unavailable in accessible formats
- Lack of consultation and involvement people with disabilities excluded from decision-making in matters
- Lack of data and evidence. A lack of rigorous and comparable data and evidence on programmes that work
