### **Independent Living**

### **Our Official New Name**

As of the 1st April, the Housing Service and team officially changed its name to Independent Living and Specialist Services. The service name has always been a little confusing as we do not provide housing, we provide the support for people to live as independently as they can.

Independent Living will incorporate:

- Our 8 Supported Living Locations.
- Outreach Services: Islington Outreach and Camden Floating Support.
- Specialist Services Positive Behaviour Support (PBS).





# Renewing the Leigh Road Contract

We're delighted to announce that we have been awarded the contract for the Leigh Road supported living project, following five successful years running the service. Huge congratulations to Maria and her team for all of their hard work and it's recognition throughout the tendering process.

The Independent Living Service has also recently been successful in gaining a place on the tendering framework for Waltham Forest and surrounding boroughs and is looking forward to setting up some new supported Living in Brent. An exciting year ahead with new opportunities for the team.

### **Islington Parent Carer Forum**

Islington Parent Carer Forum is run by a group of parent carers who have built strong relationships with Islington Council and other organisations within the borough.

The group work towards helping to provide its members information about services in the borough and work to improve services and issues around Health, Education and social care.

In January the Forum was awarded funding which enabled them to fund Essential Food Parcels for families and carers struggling during Covid times.

The Forum have been able to help 84 families in Islington!!

#### **Kickstart Scheme**

Over the past 8 months, Centre 404 have been preparing to participate in the government's brand new initiative, the 'Kickstart Scheme'.

The purpose of the scheme is to help young people aged 16-24 years old, who are also on universal credit, gain essential skills and experience to assist them getting into future long-term, sustainable employment.

We have created 30 brand new roles and are now starting to receive referrals and applications through from the DWP. We can't wait to welcome the Kickstarter's on-board over the coming months!

#### **Staff Retention**

Centre 404 regularly receives positive feedback from our service users and/or their family carers that our presence is reassuring and that we provide a solid foundation and back drop to their lives. A huge part of this is the staff and volunteers who continue to work at Centre 404 and stay with us over a number of years 5 years, 10 years and longer. The importance of this consistency and dedication to our service users cannot be underestimated. We are proud to have a lower staff turnover than generally within the sector and will continue to work with staff and volunteers to understand how we can continue to make Centre 404 a great place to work.
